
Mill Road Winter Fair Food/Drink Stalls

Please find below information about offering or selling food or drink on a stall at the Mill Road Winter Fair

Food Fair Location

The main Food Fair will be located in Gwydir Street Car Park and at the Mill Road end of St Barnabas Road. Both locations are shown with a blue star on the map below. However, there will be stalls selling food and drink throughout the fair and other possible sites are shown as blue circles on the map.

The Gwydir Street car park will be officially closed to the public from the Friday evening. However stallholders are advised not to leave their vehicles here overnight. "No Parking" notices will be posted 2 weeks before the event and full closure signage the week leading up to the event.



Food Safety, food business registration and alcohol licensing

Catering or selling food items at an event is considered a high risk activity. It is therefore important that all stall holders read and follow the guidance provided by the Food Safety Team at Cambridge City Council. These are available at <https://www.cambridge.gov.uk/food-safety>. The food safety guidance applies to all stall holders, including professional food or catering organizations, Mill Road traders offering food items outside their premises or one-off stall holders. **All stallholders must take full responsibility for the safety of their stalls. The food safety guidance and safety responsibility applies to all stallholders.** Please note that any shops that cater outside their premises should have accessible wash hand facilities which may consist of anti-bacterial soap, paper towel and a supply of hot water at the point where they are serving.

It is a requirement that all Food Fair stalls state on the application form whether they are a registered food business or whether they are operating on behalf of a charity/community group as a one-off event.

All professional food or catering organisations will be required to provide details of the local authority with which they are registered (as a food business) on the Mill Road Winter Fair food stalls application form. All registered food businesses will be asked to provide evidence of their 'scores on the doors' from their last inspection and will also be asked to provide copies of their public and employers' liability insurance certificates – all by email. We cannot confirm acceptance of your stall application until this paperwork has been received and verified.

If you are hoping to operate a stall on behalf of a charity or community group and this is a one off event, there is no requirement to register as a Food Business with the local authority (or Cambridge City Council). It is your responsibility to make sure that your food business is registered with the relevant local authority. If you are selling alcohol (including mulled wine), it is your responsibility to make sure that you have the necessary licences and comply with all conditions and legislation – <https://www.cambridge.gov.uk/alcohol-and-entertainment-licensing> and you must send us a copy of licences by email. Please note that you do need an alcohol licence if you are selling mulled wine. We cannot confirm acceptance of your stall application until this paperwork has been received and verified. It is your responsibility to apply for a TEN for the location of your stall pitch at the Fair.

Please also make sure that you are aware of any allergens are in your food products and that stall operators can make this information available on request.

Cambridge City Council will receive details of all the food businesses operating at the Mill Road Winter Fair. You will also need to bring paper copies of your food business and/or alcohol licence so that they are available for verification at spot checks on the day

Please ensure you read all the relevant advice that is available on the Council's website and the Food Standards Agency website and that you have obtained the necessary licences – as a food business and/or for selling alcohol before applying for a stall. You will need to bring paper copies of your food business and alcohol licence so that they are available for verification at spot checks on the day. Please contact the Council's licensing officer if you are uncertain about eligibility or require advice. You will be required to acknowledge you have read and understood the Council's food safety guidance as part of your application for a stall at the Mill Road Winter Fair.

An eco-friendly Fair

We are aiming for an eco-friendly event and ask that all stallholders use only biodegradable paper containers/wrappers to serve food/drink and wooden implements (eg for cutlery) at the Mill Road Winter Fair. No plastic cups!

Application Process

Bookings for the Food Fair must be made using the on-line application form available from 1st September to 1st October on the website – www.millroadwinterfair.org. Please use the Food/Drink Application Form if you are planning to sell food or drink at the fair.

Once applications have been received, they will be assessed by the committee. Space is limited due to health and safety legislation so it may not be possible to accommodate all applications. You will be notified of the status of your application by 30 October. If you are not allocated a space, you will be placed on the waitlist. All successful applicants will be required to complete a simple risk assessment for their stall as a precondition to accepting a stall pitch offer. A basic template will be supplied for this purpose.

Stall pitches must be paid for before the event. Invoices will be sent once the booking is accepted.

- Stall holders will need to provide gazebos, tables and any other items required. Gazebos will need to be adequately secured or weighted (5L water containers filled with sand or water are a cheap alternative to weights)
- Power generators can be used on site but please make sure these are small, non smoky and quiet. Note that the use of petrol generators is prohibited. The refuelling of generators at the Fair is also prohibited
- Hexagonal gazebos are not permitted.
- Given the size of the venue & safety issues we may not be able to accommodate large vehicles or trailers. Many of the stall sites have narrow entrances, little turning space and overhead barriers. You will be required to provide accurate dimensions for your stall, van or trailer on the Application Form for a stall pitch.

Pitch Allocation

Pitches will be allocated by the Mill Road Winter Fair Committee based on the space requirements you requested on your application form and consideration to health and safety guidelines. Pitch allocation is agreed in advance by the event safety board and are non-negotiable. More information about the process we use to allocate stall pitches is available on the Stall Allocation Factsheet. We expect the allocation process to be completed towards the end of October and you will receive a confirmation email if your application is successful. You will then be sent an invoice which should be paid prior to the event.

Due to over-subscription and limited food fair places, it may not be possible to accommodate all applications. Applications are researched (website) categorized by type and assessed fairly by the committee. No preference is given to any stall even if they have attended the Mill Road Winter Fair in previous years. There is usually some movement of stall bookings leading up to the event and occasionally new sites become available. Stalls on the waitlist will be contacted by email if places arise.

All stallholders at the Mill Road Winter Fair Food Fair are required to acknowledge comprehension of the Food Safety Guidance during the application process and comply with the food hygiene standards and hand washing guidelines outlined in the documents available on our website.

Road Closure

Mill Road will be closed to traffic from East Road to Coleridge Road for the duration of the fair (9.00-am – 5.10pm). The trading hours during the fair are 10:30 to 4.15 and all traders are required to cease trading at 4.15 and be cleared away by 5.00pm.

Offsite Parking

During the event vehicles should be parked off site. For information about local street parking and car parks, please visit <https://www.cambridge.gov.uk/parking>. The nearest public car park is the Queen Anne Terrace at Parkers Piece.

Gwydir Street Car Park, St Barnabas Road and Lloyds Bank Car Park Food Fair Sites

Gwydir Street Car Park is a council run facility. It is surrounded by shops and residential housing. Some spaces are also privately owned. The end of St Barnabas Road closest to Mill Road will be closed to traffic as part of the fair and we have permission to use parking spaces along one side of the road for food stalls. The Lloyds Bank Car Park is accessed from St Barnabas Road.

The Mill Road Committee works with the residents/owners in the vicinity of these venues to enlist their support in allowing use of all the Gwydir Street and Lloyds Banks Car Park spaces on the day of the fair. In return, stall holders are asked to respect these sites, ensuring residential fences are not touched, gates are left unblocked and the surface of the car park is not damaged. Stall holders are also asked to manage their own litter. Basic bin facilities are available but these are for general public use.

There is no access to power on site.

Council-run public toilets are available at the Gwydir Street Car Park.

Stallholders need to provide their own tables, chairs and gazebos at these sites.

Setting up and closing down at the event

Gwydir Street Car Park is accessed from Mill Road. There is only one combined entrance and exit and turn around space is limited.

Due to the limited entry/exit access from Gwydir Street and the lack of turn-around space, stall holders will be asked to arrive at different times.

Stall holders need to drop their items off and remove their cars immediately from the site to allow others to unload. This has proved difficult in past years, so please comply. Volunteers are on site to safeguard belongings while your car is removed.

St Barnabas Road and the Lloyds Bank Car Park are accessed from Tenison Road/St Barnabas Road and are not accessible from Mill Road. The system for unloading items and removing vehicles will be the same as for the Gwydir Street car park and again volunteers will be on site to assist.

Pitches will be allocated by the Mill Road Fair Committee and approved by the Safety Committee. Stallholders will be allocated their pitch on arrival by the Volunteer Stewards. Occasionally public cars have been left in the car park. We will work around them, so stall holders are asked to be obliging if they are requested to move position.

For Food Stallholders not operating from sites allocated by the Mill Road Winter Fair Committee

The Mill Road Winter Fair only manages the food related stalls that it allocates.
